FOR FAMILY, FRIENDS & GROUPS

1. If you've ever started to read through the Bible and quit somewhere along the way, what stopped you?
2. What's the relationship between the Old Testament book of Leviticus and the New Testament epistle of Hebrews? Take a minute to read the NIV Study Bible's intro to Hebrews (or watch the Bible Project's 8:17 minute video) and summarize 3 or 4 things you learned about this epistle.
3. Read Hebrews 2:10. From what you know about the pioneers who settled Illinois, what sorts of hardships did they face? What hardships did Jesus face in coming to earth to save us? How does this make you feel?
4. Read Hebrews 2:10-13. In what sense was Jesus "made perfect" (v.10)? Do you think it was easier or harder for Jesus to obey God than it is for you? Explain. With what two resources did Jesus resist Satan's temptations in the wilderness? (See Matthew 4:1, 4.)
5. Give an example from your life of where your obedience needs some perfecting. How does Jesus motivate you to pursue that?
6. Read Hebrews 2:14, 15. What are some of the reasons that people fear death? How did Satan gain the power of death? How does Jesus set us free from the power of death?
7. Read Hebrews 2:16-18. Why does Jesus' humanity make him a "faithful and merciful" help in temptation? Why was Jesus' battle with temptation much more intense than ours? What would Jesus want you to do when facing temptation (v.18)?
